INAP had an exciting second half of 2009. The completed GARD GuideTM was successfully rolled out at the 8th ICARD in Skelleftea, Sweden at the end of June. During the ensuing months, several informational and training workshops on the GARD Guide were presented at various global locations. INAP also sponsored a 2-day water treatment workshop with Freeport MacMoRan during October in Thatcher, Arizona. The global reach of INAP may expand further as two more mining companies have requested INAP membership. Also, organizations in Brazil, China and Indonesia have been admitted into the Global Alliance (GA).

1. GARD Guide

The GARD GuideTM roll out was a success. The Guide was officially presented to the mining community at a plenary session of the 8th ICARD in Skelleftea, Sweden on June 23, 2009. Overviews on the GARD Guide were presented at the conference.

The GARD Guide was completed on time and within budget. It required over 2500 man-hours with 30 key contributors throughout the global mining community. Since it was placed on the Wiki there have been over 10,000 hits on the Guide. The feed-back has been mostly positive ("pro-active" and "sincere").

There are a number of frequently asked questions regarding the GARD Guide:

- Is there a hard copy? No. (The GARD Guide is a fluid document and thus will be continually updated. The format allows the GARD Guide to link to outside relevant documents and references.)
- Do you really look at our comments? Yes
- We would like more case studies. INAP is compiling more and will include them in future updates.
- Is the GARD Guide available in Spanish? Other Languages? Not at present. INAP is anticipating a Spanish translation within the coming year. We will them proceed to other languages.

Since the roll out there have been several global activities which have included the GARD Guide. A discussion workshop in Perth, Australia was facilitated by Dave Salmon and others from Golder Associates and ACMER. Nico Bezuidenhout and Meiring du Plessis worked with others in South Africa to present a training workshop in Pretoria, South Africa during the International Mine Water Conference. Jim Gusek participated in the Lake Superior "Webinar". Mike O'Kane presented a paper at the BC MEND Workshop in Vancouver in December 2009 addressing the waste cover issues presented in the GARD Guide. Also in the last 6 months, two articles on the GARD Guide have been published in professional journals. "The Global Acid Rock Drainage Guide (GARD Guide)" was published in the December 2009 issue of Mine Water and the Environment and "The GARD Guide is available to review online" was published in the June 2009 issue of

Mining Engineering. More articles are slated for other publications during 2010.

Many interactive educational presentations on the GARD Guide are planned. The next presentation scheduled is a one-day short course on the use of the GARD Guide at the SME Annual Meeting in Phoenix, AZ on February 28, 2010. This short course is being taught by Drs. Tom Wildeman, CSM; Dirk van Zyl, UBC; Rens Verburg, Golder Associates and Terrence Chatwin, INAP. It will use a case study approach with a hypothetical model mine. INAP is planning to use this short course as a format for future training workshops and short courses. INAP and Global Alliance members will find this short course very valuable, so register with the SME before the early registration discount expires.

Jim Robertson, Tom Claridge and Terry Chatwin made presentations on the GARD Guide during a visit to Washington D.C. in early January of 2010. They met with several key stakeholders including the International Finance Corporation (IFC), the US Office of Surface Mining (OSM), the Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA), the National Mining Association (NMA) and the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). Responses were positive from all of the groups.

2. ICARD

Two groups, ASMR and MEND, presented bids to host the 9th ICARD during the closing session of the 8th ICARD. After thoughtful consideration, INAP membership voted to award the bid to MEND. It will host the 9th ICARD in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada in late May of 2012 at the Westin Hotel.

In early December 2009, Gilles Tremblay updated INAP's OpCom and Global Alliance members on the planning progress at their meetings in Vancouver, BC. Gilles informed INAP that MEND has a committee partially in place and planning for the ICARD has begun. MEND is planning a "stand alone" conference. Groups and associations are already requesting to be sponsors of this event. INAP has affirmed its support to Gilles Tremblay, MEND and the 9th ICARD Committee. They will determine how INAP can best be of assistance.

3. Water Treatment Workshop

Tom Claridge (Freeport McMoRan) hosted the Water Treatment Workshop held in Thatcher, Arizona, in October, 2009, which has sponsored by INAP. Thatcher is in the heart of the Arizona mining industry. It was well received with approximately 70 people attending the 2-day event. Six of INAP's nine member companies were represented as well as international attendees from Canada, Peru and South Africa. Many of the presentations (60-70%) were given by representatives from INAP companies. The papers covered a wide range of topics. About 10% of the papers addressed innovative water treatment technologies. Dave Riesman from US EPA gave an excellent presentation on actions EPA is taking to team with the mining industry to

address ARD. We thank Tom Claridge (Freeport McMoRan) and his committee, Hoe Teh (Barrick), Rich Borden (Rio Tinto), Linda Broughton, BHP Billiton and Terry Chatwin (INAP) for their efforts.

Lisa Lanteigne (Vale Inco) has agreed to host the next workshop in the fall of 2010 in Sudbury, Ontario, Canada. The following workshop will be held in Elko, NV in 2011.

4. Global Alliance

INAP has extended invitations to Brazilian, Chinese and Indonesian groups to join the Global Alliance. Flavio Vasconcelos from Brazil attended the Global Alliance meeting in Vancouver, B.C. in December of 2009. INAP's profile is growing internationally and the Global Alliance is an important part of this growth.

The Global Alliance is key to having the GARD Guide promoted in their areas of the world. The success of the GARD Guide is dependent on it being used on the local level.
